Sporting Memories is committed to complying with privacy and data protection laws including:

(a) The General Data Protection Regulation (“**the GDPR**”) and any related legislation which applies in the UK, including, without limitation, any legislation derived from the Data Protection Bill 2017;

(b) The Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations (2003) and any successor or related legislation, including without limitation, E-Privacy Regulation 2017/0003; and

(c) All other applicable laws and regulations relating to the processing of personal data and privacy, including statutory instruments and, where applicable, the guidance and codes of practice issued by the Information Commissioner’s Office (“ICO”) or any other supervisory authority.

(together “**the Legislation**”)

Sporting Memories have policies that sets out what we do to protect individuals’ personal data and anyone who handles personal data in any way on behalf of Sporting Memories must ensure that we comply with these policies.

Any breach of these policies will be taken seriously and may result in disciplinary action or more serious sanctions.

The types of personal data that we may handle include details of: Directors: Employees: Volunteers: Contractors: Patrons: Donors: Ambassadors: Supporters: Attendees of our clubs and activities and Next of kin.
